TRACKING YOUR REQUIREMENTS

One course can meet more than one requirement. Therefore, a course may be listed under more than one heading.

For example, if you are pursuing a General Major in the Humanities, the course Philosophy 3406 would count toward the major; it would count toward the senior course requirement; it would be listed as a non-Science course for the B.A.; and, it would be used in the General Liberal Education Requirement as a Humanities course. Philosophy 3406 would therefore be listed four times, since it is part of four separate requirements.

FACULTY OF EDUCATION ADMISSION

Admission to the Faculty of Education requires successful completion of the following:

- ___ 20 semester courses (60.0 credit hours).
- ___ Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all UofL and transferable courses taken within the semesters containing the last 20 courses (60.0 credit hours).
- ___ Minimum major course requirement:
 - ___ Eleven courses in the 16-course General Major, including at least five courses in the main teaching subject area
- ___ Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all graded courses comprising the major, including all transferable courses.
- ___ Education 2500 (including a favourable recommendation).

This is an introductory Education course with a supervised field experience component to assist students in making a decision concerning admission into the Faculty of Education and to assist the Faculty in determining the appropriateness of the student's admission. It is offered regularly each semester. The field experience component consists of two three-hour or three two-hour blocks of time in the morning for student practicum in school classrooms.

Prerequisites for Education 2500: Second-year standing (a minimum of 30.0 credit hours) AND a GPA of 2.50, calculated on all University of Lethbridge and transferable courses.
- ___ Writing Proficiency Requirement:

Demonstrated proficiency in written and oral English. A student may meet the Writing Proficiency Requirement in any of the following ways:

 - obtaining a grade of 75 percent or higher on the English Language Arts 30-I Alberta Diploma exam
 - obtaining a final grade of 80 percent or higher in English Language Arts 30-I or its equivalent from any province
 - passing the Alberta Universities' Writing Competence Test (AUWCT)
 - obtaining a pass in the 'Writing for University' course
 - obtaining a grade of 'B' (3.00 on a 4.0 scale) or higher in Writing 1000
 - obtaining a grade of 'B' (3.00 on a 4.0 scale) or higher in a university English course
 - successful completion of a recognized degree from an English-language university
- ___ Specific major requirements (if applicable):
 - a. Drama Education - completion of an acceptable portfolio, performance audition and interview.
 - b. Music Education - completion of an acceptable performance audition and/or interview.
 - c. Native Education - completion of five of the seven courses required in the school subject minor.*
 - d. Physical Education - completion of a Physical Education and Sport Activities report.

**Some minors have additional admission requirements.*

- ___ Application to the Faculty of Education (see www.uleth.ca/ross/admissions/deadlines.html for application and document deadlines). Application forms may be picked up at and submitted to the Registrar's Office and Student Services (ROSS) (SUI40; tel. 403-320-5700).

Students should note that completion of pre-Education requirements does not guarantee admission to the Faculty of Education. The enrolment limit is normally 216, with 16 positions for each major. For qualified applicants admission decisions are based primarily on evaluation of performance in Education 2500 and grade point average calculated on all UofL and transferable courses taken within the semesters containing the last 20 university-level courses (60.0 credit hours), including courses in a previous degree and courses taken subsequently. The Faculty of Education has an admission policy for students of Aboriginal descent and students with a significant shift in academic performance (see the current Calendar for more information).
