- Spanish Four courses in Spanish
- Note: Students interested in pursuing a language other than those listed above are advised to contact Student Program Services in the Faculty of Management for more details.
- The Language Minor will be acknowledged on the official transcript.
- If the University does not offer a sufficient number of courses to meet the four-course Note: Language Minor, students may obtain permission from the Faculty of Management to attend other institutions in order to fulfill their language requirements and credit will be approved toward the University of Lethbridge degree.
