About the Women and Gender Studies Major	Women and Gender Studies provides an interdisciplinary environment for the examination of historical and contemporary significance of women from a global perspective. Analyses of culture, social institutions, human development and behaviour, and the gender constructions on which they are based, form the foundation of the program offerings in Women and Gender Studies. Focusing on embodiment, and utilizing feminist theories, concepts, and methodologies, the major in Women and Gender Studies seeks to inform, transform, and expander traditional forms of knowledge about women and gender in a culturally inclusive framework.
Utilizing Knowledge and Research From Diverse Fields	Utilizing knowledge and research from such diverse fields as biology, health sciences, history, indigenous studies, psychology, philosophy, sociology, economics, anthropology, literature, political science, and ethics, students in Women and Gender Studies learn about the ways in which women's lives and gender have been constructed, how they have changed, and how they continue to change. The intersection of the study of gender with that of race, class, age, ethnicity, sexuality, and other social constructs will be utilized to inform students of the complex and often sensitive issues involved in the study of women and the global movements to achieve equity.
All Students Have the Opportunity to Major in Women and Gender Studies	All students have the opportunity to major in Women and Gender Studies or to take individual courses in Women and Gender Studies to add to and expand their knowledge and understanding within other disciplinary majors.
Co-operative Education	A Co-op option, requiring three work terms, is available. Students interested in the Co-operative Education/Internship program should contact the Coordinator of Co-operative Education in the Career Resources Centre (AH154 phone: 403-382-7154) for further information.
Program Requirements	The B.A. degree with a major in Women and Gender Studies requires 40 semester courses, including a minimum of 13 courses in the Women and Gender Studies. A maximum of 20 courses in Women and Gender Studies is allowed.
Transfer Credit	Remember that you may use both University of Lethbridge credit and credit transferred from another college or university to meet degree and major requirements. Transfer credit may be either specified or unspecified. Specified credit is indicated on your transcript by the subject name and the specific number of the course, e.g., Women and Gender Studies 1000, 2700, etc. Unspecified credit (1XXX, 2XXX, etc.) is indicated by the subject name and level of the course in parentheses, e.g., Women and Gender Studies (1000 level), Women and Gender Studies (2000 level), etc.
Unspecified Course Credit	Unspecified course credit means that the University of Lethbridge does not offer the same course you transferred in, but we recognize it and treat it as a regular course. An unspecified course would count as one of your maximum of 20 from one department, but it could not meet a specific course requirement. For example, if Women and Gender Studies 2700 is required in your program, you could not use Women and Gender Studies (2000 level) to fulfill that requirement. Students with unspecified transfer credit need to consult an Academic Advisor to establish how the transfer credit fits in the degree program. This should be done as soon as possible after transfer credit is awarded.

Women and Gender Studies

This is a planning guide and not a graduation check or guarantee of course offerings. You should have a program check done in your final year of studies. Students are responsible for the accuracy of their own programs. The guide should be used in conjunction with the University of Lethbridge Calendar, which is the final authority on all questions regarding program requirements and academic regulations.
