About the Addictions Counselling major

The Addictions Counselling major provides students with the practical skills and the theoretical knowledge needed for an effective and compassionate role in treatment, prevention and health promotion wherever addiction, or the potential for addiction, affects people's lives. The Addictions Counselling major considers a range of intervention strategies and addictive behaviours, including substance abuse, problem gambling, and sexual or eating disorders.

Admission Requirements

High school applicants applying to the Addictions Counselling program must hold a 65% high school average to be considered. Transfer applicants with eight or more transferrable courses must have an admission grade point average of 2.00 on a 4.00 point scale.

All applicants must satisfy completion of these Alberta high school courses, or equivalents:

- English Language Arts 30-1
- Biology 30 or Chemistry 30
- Two other 30-level 'academic' courses
- A fifth course at the 30-level (not including Special Projects)

Applicants must also provide an Admission Statement.

Admission Statement

All applicants must submit an Admission Statement to the Admissions Office by June 1. The mandatory Admission Statement provides the Faculty of Health Sciences with the experience, inspirations, and goals of applicants to the Addictions Counselling program. The Admission Statement form is available at:

Since the number of qualified applicants can exceed the number of places available, fulfillment of the minimum academic or statement requirements does not guarantee admission to the Addictions Counselling major in the B.H.Sc. program. The process is competitive and the Faculty of Health Sciences reserves the right of selection of all students for admission and readmission to the Faculty.

Application Deadline

Applications must be received by June 1 for consideration for admission to the subsequent Fall semester. An Application for Admission can be completed at ApplyAlberta.ca.
