Advanced placement may be granted to students who have acquired German language skills outside of a formal academic environment. Linguistics 2300 may replace one of the required five additional courses in German.

_____ Not more than four courses (12.0 credit hours) from disciplines offered outside the Faculty of Arts and Science or the Faculty of Fine Arts may be completed for credit towards the degree (i.e. labelled CDEV, CRED, EDUC, HLSC, MGT, NURS, and PUBH). Courses cross-listed between the Faculty of Arts and Science and another Faculty do not count towards this limit.

² Depending on their academic background in German, students may have to take one or more Independent Study courses in German in order to complete the major. For further details, see the First-Year German Coordinator in the Department of Modern Languages.

³ Contact the German Off-Campus Studies Coordinator for information regarding the German Visiting Student Program. The minimum requirements for the German Visiting Student Program (GVSP) comprise a total of six courses. Students may wish to take four additional approved courses during this year or will need to complete four additional Arts and Science courses to satisfy degree requirements.

Terms Used

GLER course: A course that could count toward the General Liberal Education Requirement. You may use courses in your major towards this 12-course requirement. See the 2013/2014 University of Lethbridge Calendar, Part 4 - Academic Regulations (p. 88) for complete information.

The Faculty of Arts and Science offers Liberal Education 1000 and 2000, specifically designed to introduce first-year students to the wide scope of human knowledge and teach essential university success skills, critical thinking, and integrative thinking (see the 2013/2014 University of Lethbridge Calendar, Part 14 - Courses, p. 307). LBED 1000 and 2000 may be used toward satisfying the GLER.

Elective: A course that you may choose freely from all those available and applicable to your program. Use courses inside or outside your major, bearing in mind any restrictions that may apply (e.g., a maximum of 24 courses from any one discipline).
