An approved degree is a baccalaureate degree (with 30 courses or more), or its academic equivalent, from a recognized degree-granting institution. Other three-year International baccalaureate degrees or Applied Degrees may be considered a basis for admission to second degree programs with the prior approval of the Dean of the Faculty of Management.				
Program Requirements	Second degree programs consist of the Arts and Science and Management courses required for the chosen major. Upon admission, an advisor in the Faculty of Management's Undergraduate Programs Office will review your previous educational background and design a program tailored for you. You will then receive notification of the courses required including the approval of advance credit or course waivers. Consult the University Calendar and Timetables for complete course information.
