Year 3 Semester I

MGT 3061 - Information Systems and Management
MGT 3650 - Introduction to International Management (PREREQS: 15 university-level courses (a minimum of 45.0 credit hours))
One of: MATH 1510 - Calculus for Management and Social Sciences (PREREQS: One of MATH 30-1, Pure MATH 30, or MATH 0500) MATH 1560 - Calculus I (Science) (PREREQS: One of MATH 1010, MATH 31, or at least 75% in MATH 30-1 or Pure MATH 30)
STAT 1770 - Introduction to Probability and Statistics (Science) (PREREQS: One of MATH 30-1, MATH 30-2, Pure MATH 30, or MATH 0500)
One of: WRIT 1000 or a university English course (Fine Arts & Humanities)

Year 4 Semester I

MGT 2070/ECON 2070 - Operations and Quantitative Management (Science) (PREREQS: STAT 1770; 2nd-year standing)
MGT 3050/POLI 3420 - Human Resource Management (Social Science) (PREREQS: One of WRIT 1000 or a university English course)
Management 3412 - Fundamentals of Investments (PREREQS: MGT 3040; One of ECON 2900 or STAT 2780)
One of: MGT 3441, 3460, 3480, 4421, 4460, 4470-4471¹ (PREREQS: see current Calendar)
Fine Arts & Humanities Course

1. Management 4470 and 4471 must be taken in sequence (Fall > Spring) in order to receive credit. In the fall semester, students will register in Management 4470, with 0.0 credit hours and 1.5 billing hours, and will be given an "X" grade at the end of that semester. In the following spring semester, students will register in Management 4471, with 3.0 credit hours and 1.5 billing hours. At the end of the spring semester, students will be given a final letter grade (for Management 4471).

MGT 4090 - Management Policy and Strategy (PREREQS: 4th-year standing; MGT 3031; MGT 3050/POLI 3420; MGT 3061)
MGT 4430 - Financial Management (PREREQS: MGT 3412; MGT 3470)
MGT 4451 - Derivative Securities Markets (PREREQS: MGT 3412; MGT 3470)
One of: MGT 3441, 3460, 3480, 4421, 4460 (PREREQS: see current Calendar)

NOTES

Prerequisites & Corequisites

2015/2016 prereqs and coreqs are given in parentheses below each applicable course, but are subject to change. Check prereqs and coreqs in the current Academic Calendar or Timetable for each course before registering.

Modified General Liberal Education Requirement (GLER)

10 Arts and Science courses are required and built into the program as follows:

- 4 List I - Fine Arts & Humanities
- 2 List II - Social Science
- 2 List III - Science
- 2 any list (List I, II or III)

Duplicate Courses

Students who are admitted to the Post-Diploma B.Mgt. program cannot receive credit for courses at the U of L for which they have equivalent credit in their diplomas. Substitute courses must be approved by the Faculty of Management. Diploma courses that satisfy Core Requirements must have a minimum grade of 'C-'.

Extra Courses

Extra courses are assigned where a diploma does not provide the appropriate background for the major chosen.

Residence Requirement

Students must complete at least 20 University of Lethbridge courses.

Minimum Grade Requirement

A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in ECON 1010; ECON 1012; STAT 1770; WRIT 1000 OR a university English course; and all Management courses in order to meet degree requirements.

Repeated Courses

Submit a 'Repeated Course Form' through the Registrar's Office for each repeated course so only the most recent attempt is calculated in the GPA.

Sequencing

Courses in this major may not be offered every semester. Consult timetables and academic advisors.
