Year 3 Semester I

MGT 3061 - Information Systems and Management

Year 4 Semester I

1. International Management Electives: Students must complete four courses from the following: MGT 3070, MGT 3460, MGT 3640, MGT 3660/GEOG 3225, MGT 3670/POLI 3170, MGT 3552, MGT 3685, MGT 3690, MGT 3815, MGT 3860, MGT 4220, MGT 4580, MGT 4640. Students may take up to two series courses to meet the "Four of" Elective requirement: two offerings in the Management 3685 series; two offerings in the Management 3815 series; or one offering from each series.
2. The international exchange semester can be completed earlier in the degree, please see International Programs for more information.

Language Minor:

In addition to completing an international exchange semester as part of the major, students in the International Management major must declare and complete a Language minor. The Language minor will be acknowledged on the official transcript. All Language courses completed prior to the exchange must have a minimum grade of 'C-.' Students must select one of the following minors:

- French - Four courses in French
- German - Four courses in German

Note: Admission to the minor in German in the International Management major for the B.Mgt. has been suspended, beginning May 1, 2013 (i.e. for the 2013/2014 academic year and thereafter, until further notice).

- Japanese - Four courses in Japanese
- Spanish - Four courses in Spanish

Note: If the University does not offer a sufficient number of courses to meet the four-course Language minor, students may obtain permission from the Faculty of Management to attend other institutions in order to fulfill their language requirements and credit will be approved toward the University of Lethbridge degree. The International Management major includes an international exchange semester. In general, a student may not select his or her native language as the language of study.

All students in the International Management major are required to participate in an international exchange. Students study at an international university for one semester, and take the equivalent of the following courses while on the exchange:
 Two 3000/4000 level Management electives
 Two electives chosen to meet the General Liberal Education Requirement
 The exchange courses are part of the 20 courses required for the Bachelor of Management degree.
 Students participating in a European exchange must complete a minimum of courses equivalent to 24.0 credits under the European Credit Transfer Accumulation System (ECTS). Course credits completed at an international university may vary from the U of L credit system.

Prerequisites & Corequisites

2015/2016 prereqs and coreqs are given in parentheses below each applicable course, but are subject to change. Check prereqs and coreqs in the current Academic Calendar or Timetable for each course before registering.

Modified General Liberal Education Requirement (GLER)

10 Arts and Science courses are required and built into the program as follows:

- 4 List I - Fine Arts & Humanities
- 2 List II - Social Science
- 2 List III - Science
- 2 any list (List I, II or III)

Duplicate Courses

Students who are admitted to the Post-Diploma B.Mgt. program cannot receive credit for courses at the U of L for which they have equivalent credit in their diplomas. Substitute courses must be approved by the Faculty of Management. Diploma courses that satisfy Core Requirements must have a minimum grade of 'C-.'

Extra Courses

Extra courses are assigned where a diploma does not provide the appropriate background for the major chosen.

Residence Requirement

Students must complete at least 20 University of Lethbridge courses.

Minimum Grade Requirement

A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in ECON 1010; ECON 1012; STAT 1770; WRIT 1000 OR a university English course; all Management courses; and all courses marked with an asterisk (*) in order to meet degree requirements.

Repeated Courses

Submit a 'Repeated Course Form' through the Registrar's Office for each repeated course so only the most recent attempt is calculated in the GPA.

Sequencing

Courses in this major may not be offered every semester. Consult timetables and academic advisors.
