- _____ Credit in Education 2500 - Practicum I - Orientation to Teaching (or equivalent) including a favourable recommendation from the instructor.

Prerequisites & Corequisites

Introductory Course Limit

Not more than 10 courses (30 credit hours) may be completed at the 1000 level (or lower) for credit toward the degree.

Residence Requirement

All students must complete at least 30 University of Lethbridge courses, 10 in Management (7 of which must be 3000/4000-level) and 15 Education courses (three professional semesters).

Minimum Grade Requirement

A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in ECON 1010; ECON 1012; STAT 1770; WRIT 1000 OR a university English course; and all Management courses in order to meet degree requirements in the Faculty of Management. However, if a student chooses to meet the Faculty of Education's Writing Proficiency Requirement (WPR) by completing WRIT 1000 or a university-English course, a minimum grade of 'B' is required. The Faculty of Education requires a minimum program grade point average of 2.50 in Education courses and the courses comprising the major.

Sequencing

Courses in this major may not be offered every semester. Consult timetables and academic advisors.

Management Minors
