Faculty of Education Admission

Admission to the Faculty of Education requires successful completion of the following:

- _____ 20 semester courses (60.0 credit hours).
- _____ Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all UofL and transferable courses taken within the semesters containing the last 20 courses (60.0 credit hours). If any part of the diploma falls within the last 20 courses (60.0 credit hours), the entirety of the diploma (i.e., diploma GPA) is included in the calculation. All courses must be graded with the exception of Education 2500.
- _____ Minimum of eight courses (24.0 credit hours) in the major.
- _____ Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all graded courses comprising the major, including all diploma courses.
- _____ Credit in Education 2500 - Practicum I - Orientation to Teaching (or equivalent) including a favourable recommendation from the instructor.

Sample Sequencing Plan

Shown below is a sample sequence of courses for your degree. If you follow this plan, you should be able to graduate in three and a half years, provided you complete five courses per semester. This is just one example of how you could complete your major and degree requirements; you may find that a different sequence works as well as this one.

Modified General Liberal Education Requirement (GLER)

7 Arts and Science courses are required and built into the program as follows:

- 3 List I - Fine Arts & Humanities
- 2 List II - Social Science
- 2 List III - Science

Duplicate Courses

Students who are admitted to the Post-Diploma B.Mgt./B.Ed. program cannot receive credit for courses at the U of L for which they have equivalent credit in their diplomas. Substitute courses must be approved by the Faculty of Management. Diploma courses that satisfy Core Requirements must have a minimum grade of 'C-'.

Extra Courses

Extra courses are assigned where a diploma does not provide the appropriate background for the major chosen. Students who choose a major other than General Management should meet with a Faculty of Management Academic Advisor and may be required to extend their program beyond 35 courses.

Residence Requirement

Students must complete at least 30 courses at the U of L, including a minimum of 8 Management courses and 15 Education courses (three Professional Semesters).

Minimum Grade Requirement

A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in STAT 1770, WRIT 1000 or a university English course; and all Management courses in order to meet degree requirements in the Faculty of Management. However, if a student chooses to meet the Faculty of Education's Writing Proficiency Requirement (WPR) by completing WRIT 1000 or a university English course, a minimum grade of 'B' is required. Students who take ECON 1010 or ECON 1012 as part of their degree requirements at the U of L must achieve a minimum grade of 'C-'. The Faculty of Education requires a minimum program grade point average of 2.50 in Education courses and the courses comprising the major.
