Bachelor of Fine Arts - Art/Bachelor of Education

Admission to the Faculty of Education

- _____ Completion of a minimum of 14 graded term courses (42.0 credit hours).
Note: Due to course sequencing, the Faculty of Fine Arts strongly encourages students to complete 30 courses prior to applying to the Faculty of Education.
- _____ Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all U of L and transferable courses taken within the terms containing the last 14 courses (42.0 credit hours). All courses must be graded.
- _____ Minimum of five courses (15.0 credit hours) in Art, Art History, and/or Museum Studies.
- _____ Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all graded courses comprising the major, including all transferable courses.
- _____ Credit in Education 2500 - Practicum I - Orientation to Teaching (or equivalent) including a favourable recommendation from the instructor.

Faculty of Education

Education 2500 Education 2500 is an introductory course that must be completed before admission to the program. Its main focus is to assist students in making a decision about the suitability of teaching as a career.

Field Experience One of the strengths of the University of Lethbridge Education program is the extensive amount of field experience students acquire during their two years in the faculty. Beyond Education 2500, all students teach in the schools during Professional Semesters I (five weeks), II (six weeks), and III (full term internship).

Studio Practice Students will experience many different aspects of studio practice ranging from integrating Art across the curriculum from Kindergarten through Grade 12, to teaching Art as a separate discipline. Therefore, it is recommended that students develop strong studio art skills prior to admission to the faculty.

Career Opportunities Completing a B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. or B.A./B.Ed. Combined Degrees program enables graduates to teach from K to 12. However, the B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. program better equips graduates to teach Grades 7-12, and is especially valuable for teaching Grades 10-12.

Teaching in the Practicum Art students commonly teach units on painting, ceramics, drawing, and computers, as well as another subject such as Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, or Language Arts. Therefore, students must be strong and confident in the area of Art to integrate it with other subjects.

Program Requirements The B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. Combined Degrees program requires a minimum of 50 term courses, including 30 in Fine Arts (and Arts and Science) and 20 in Education. A minimum of 22 Art, Art History, and/or Museum Studies courses (66.0 credit hours) is required. Students begin their studies in the Pre-B.F.A. - Art/B.Ed. program, taking courses in the Faculty of Fine Arts where they progress toward completion of Fine Arts degree requirements and prepare to meet the admission requirements for the Faculty of Education. Due to course sequencing, the Faculty of Fine Arts strongly encourages students to complete the majority of courses towards the B.F.A. degree requirements prior to applying to the Faculty of Education. Upon meeting Education admission criteria, students must then apply to the Faculty of Education by the applicable deadline. Students are not officially enrolled in the Combined Degrees program until they have been admitted to BOTH the Faculty of Fine Arts (through admission to the University) and the Faculty of Education.

Transfer Credit Remember that you may use both University of Lethbridge credit and credit transferred from another college or university to meet degree and major requirements. Transfer credit may be either specified or unspecified. Specified credit is indicated on your transcript by the subject name and the specific number of the course, e.g., Art History 1000, Art History 2225, etc. Unspecified credit (1XXX, 2XXX, etc.) is indicated by the subject name and the level of the course in parentheses, e.g., Art History (1000 level), Art History (2000 level), etc.

Unspecified Course Credit Unspecified course credit means that the University of Lethbridge does not offer the same course you transferred in, but we recognize it and treat it as a regular course. An unspecified course would meet an elective requirement in your program, but it could not meet a specific course requirement. For example, if Art History 2225 is required in your program, you could not use Art History (2000 level) to fulfill that requirement. Students with unspecified transfer credit need to consult an Academic Advisor to establish how the transfer credit fits in the degree program. This should be done as soon as possible after transfer credit is awarded.

_____ Completion of at least eight Art, Art History, and/or Museum Studies courses (24.0 credit hours) at the 3000/4000 level.

_____ Completion of the Liberal Education List Requirement. A maximum of four courses from one department may be counted toward this requirement. See the 2019/2020 University of Lethbridge Calendar, School of Liberal Education for complete information.

_____ A maximum of three Independent Study courses in Fine Arts.

_____ Not more than eight courses at the 0100-1000 level. For 0100-1990 courses that have a 0100/1000 level background or prerequisite, only the first course in the series counts toward this limit.

Education:

_____ Maintenance of a program grade point average of 2.50 in Education courses.

_____ Completion of the Art major, as defined by the program, with a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher on the courses comprising the major.

_____ A maximum of two Independent Study courses in Education.

Residence Requirement:

_____ Completion of a minimum of 30 courses (90.0 credit hours) at the University of Lethbridge, including 15 Education courses, and 15 courses offered by the Faculty of Fine Arts, Faculty of Arts and Science, or School of Liberal Education, including a minimum of seven courses in Art, Art History, and/or Museum Studies.

¹ Students can only include one of Art 3060 or Art 3061 within the minimum requirements.

² Education 2500 must be completed (with a Pass Recommend) before admission. It may also be taken in the spring or summer term immediately prior to the fall intake.
