- _____ Minimum of five courses (15.0 credit hours) in the major.
- _____ Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all graded courses comprising the major, including all transferable courses.
- _____ Credit in Education 2500 - Practicum I - Orientation to Teaching (or equivalent) including a favourable recommendation from the instructor.

Students are responsible for familiarizing themselves with program requirements and regulations outlined in the University of Lethbridge Calendar including, but not limited to:

Minimum Grade Requirement

A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in ECON 1010; ECON 1012; STAT 1770; WRIT 1000 OR a university English course; all Management courses, including courses cross-listed with Management; and all courses in the major marked with an asterisk (*) in order to meet degree requirements in the Dhillon School of Business. The Faculty of Education requires a minimum program grade point average of 2.50 in Education courses and the courses comprising the major.

Limit on Introductory-Level Courses

Not more than 10 courses may be taken at the 0100/1000 level for credit toward the degree. Activity courses and courses numbered in the range of 0520 to 0530 are exempted from this limit. Language courses are offered in the 0100-1990 range. Only the first course in the range counts toward this limit in the language subjects of French, Japanese and Spanish. Only one of Economics 1010 and Economics 1012 will be counted toward this limit. Only one of Biology 1010 and Biology 1020 will be counted toward this limit. Only one of Geography 1000 and Geography 1200 will be counted toward this limit.

Residence Requirement

All students must complete at least 30 University of Lethbridge courses, 10 in Management (7 of which must be 3000/4000-level) and 15 Education courses (three professional terms).

Liberal Education List Requirement (Lib Ed Requirement)

12 Lib Ed courses are required as follows: 4 List I Fine Arts & Humanities; 4 List II Social Science; 4 List III Science. Lib Ed requirements not filled by core or major courses are specified above (e.g. Elective - Fine Arts & Humanities).

Only 4 courses from one discipline (e.g. ECON, MGT, MUSI) and only 4 courses from EDUC, ABHL, ADCS, HLSC, NURS, PUBH, TREC, and MGT may be counted toward the Lib Ed List Requirement. Cross-listed courses count toward both limits (e.g. MGT 2070/ECON 2070 counts as both a MGT and an ECON).

Education Minors

See Faculty of Education in the University of Lethbridge Calendar and Course Catalogue for a list of available minors. A minor consists of five non-Education courses (excluding those used in the major) and one curriculum and instruction Education course (to be completed after admission to the Faculty of Education). Students may use the same courses to fulfill the minor and the Liberal Education List Requirement (Lib Ed Requirement).
