Department of Drama

About the Program This broad, general-focus program is appropriate for students with a technical or performance diploma in Theatre or Drama. Post-Diploma students study theatre history, acting, stagecraft, and obtain hands-on, practical, experience by participating in the series of major productions presented by the Department of Drama.

Drama Production Credit Drama 2600, 3600, and 4600 are courses that allow credit for participation in productions produced by the Department of Drama. Participation includes all performance aspects of the production process. Drama 3611 and 4611 are similar, but are limited to technical or design assignments. Registration in Drama 3611 requires the prerequisite of Drama 2810. Drama 3611 is a prerequisite for Drama 4611.

Procedure:

1. The production season is established in the spring of each year. The list is available from the Chair of the Department of Drama.
2. Students may contact the faculty member responsible for directing the play or watch the bulletin boards for notice of audition dates. Those interested in the technical aspects of the production may wish to contact the Technical Director.
3. Registration in the relevant course number normally occurs in the semester in which the production(s) will be completed. The usual course registration deadlines do not apply; however, if the course is not registered before November 15 for the Fall or March 15 for the Spring, registration will be delayed until the following semester.
4. Registration is coordinated by the Faculty of Fine Arts Advising Office.

Faculty of Education

Education 2500 Education 2500 is an introductory course that must be completed before admission to the program. Its main focus is to assist students in making a decision about the suitability of teaching as a career.

Field Experience The Faculty of Education provides extensive field experience during the two years of study in the Education program. Beyond Education 2500, all students teach in the schools during Professional Semesters I (five weeks), II (six weeks), and III (full semester internship).

Performance Because performance is an important form of communication for Drama teachers, students are encouraged to gain as much performance experience as possible by taking advantage of all the productions presented by Department of Drama. Along with the required Drama 3600, students may choose to take Drama 2600 and 4600 to gain additional performance experience.

Career Opportunities Completing a B.F.A.- Dramatic Arts/B.Ed. or B.A./B.Ed. Combined Degrees program enables graduates to teach from K to 12. However, the B.F.A.- Dramatic Arts/B.Ed. program better equips graduates to teach Grades 7-12, and is especially valuable for teaching Grades 10-12.

Teaching in the Practicum Drama students may teach units on orientation, improvisation, reader's theatre, story theatre, mime, movement and scene study, as well as other subjects such as Mathematics, Social Studies, Science or Language Arts. Therefore, students will be expected to integrate Drama with other subjects.

Dramatic Arts/Drama Education

Post-Diploma B.F.A. - Dramatic Arts/Bachelor of Education

All students begin the program classified as Pre-Post-Diploma B.F.A. - Dramatic Arts/ B.Ed. in the Faculty of Fine Arts. After the completion of 10 courses, including Education 2500 (or equivalent), students may apply to the Faculty of Education. Students are not officially in the 35-course Post-Diploma Combined Degrees program until they have been admitted to BOTH the Faculty of Fine Arts and the Faculty of Education. Admission Requirements for the Faculty of Fine Arts include:

_____ Completion of an approved* two- or three-year college diploma in Theatre or Dramatic Arts with a GPA of 2.50.

* *Approved by the Dean of the Faculty of Fine Arts in consultation with representatives from the academic discipline. Approval is dependent upon the college's program containing the courses required for the first two years of the B.F.A. - Dramatic Arts. The college program must include a minimum of 16 courses in Drama.*

A list of approved Diploma programs is available on the Admissions website (www.uleth.ca/postdiploma) or from the Admissions Office. Diplomas from other colleges will be considered on an individual basis.

_____ Portfolio: A collection of materials representative of recent theatre experiences as a performer, designer, technician, etc. A typical sample: a list of productions, roles, reviews. Also photographs, programs, video tape. Portfolio requirements are available at www.uleth.ca/finearts/departments/drama/drama-portfolio-requirements.

Admission Requirements for the Faculty of Education include:

_____ Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 on all U of L and transferable courses taken within the terms containing the last 14 courses (42.0 credit hours). If any part of the diploma falls within the last 14 courses (42.0 credit hours), the entirety of the diploma (i.e., diploma GPA) is considered in the computation. All courses must be graded.

_____ Minimum of five courses (15.0 credit hours) in Dramatic Arts.

_____ Minimum cumulative average of 2.50 on all graded courses comprising the major (including all diploma courses).

_____ Credit in Education 2500 - Orientation to Teaching (or equivalent) **prior to the fall program intake**, including a favourable recommendation from the instructor

Fine Arts:

_____ Approval, in advance, of the entire program by the Academic Advisor in the Faculty of Fine Arts.

_____ Completion of at least 15 courses from disciplines offered by the Faculty of Fine Arts, Faculty of Arts and Science, or School of Liberal Education with a grade point average of at least 2.00.

_____ Completion of at least eight Drama courses (24.0 credit hours) with a grade point average of at least 2.50.

_____ Completion of a modified Liberal Education List Requirement. Social Science and Science courses from the diploma may be used to meet this requirement. A maximum of four courses from one department may be counted toward this requirement. See the 2020/2021 University of Lethbridge Calendar, School of Liberal Education for complete information.

_____ Completion of at least eight courses (24.0 credit hours) at the 3000/4000 level.

_____ A maximum of three Independent Study courses in Fine Arts.

Education:

_____ Maintenance of a program grade point average of 2.50 in Education courses.

_____ Completion of the Drama major, as defined by the program, with a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher on the courses comprising the major.

Residence Requirement:

_____ Completion of a minimum of 35 courses (105.0 credit hours) at the University of Lethbridge, including a minimum of eight Drama courses (24.0 credit hours) and 20 Education courses (60.0 credit hours).
