Program Requirements

The Faculty of Arts and Science and the Faculty of Health Sciences are pleased to offer the Nursing Preparation Program (NPP) for applicants who do not qualify for admission to our competitive Bachelor of Nursing program. This program is designed to provide students with an opportunity to increase their admission averages, obtain required prerequisite courses, and/or complete courses that will count toward our Bachelor of Nursing program requirements. This Nursing Preparation Program may also allow prospective Bachelor of Nursing (After Degree) students to obtain required admission prerequisites and/or increase their admission GPA for that competitive program.

Frequently Asked Questions

We thank everyone who applies to the Bachelor of Nursing (B.N.) and B.N. After Degree programs at the University of Lethbridge. Unfortunately, not all qualified applicants can be accepted each year. This information sheet is intended to provide information to qualified applicants who cannot be accommodated in the B.N. programs this year due to space and resource constraints.

1. Is the University of Lethbridge maintaining a wait-list for Fall 2021 B.N. and B.N. After Degree seats?

Final seats for admission will be offered in late May/June. The most highly qualified waitlisted applicants who were not initially selected may be offered B.N. admission later, if seats become available (between July-August). The Fall 2021 wait-list will no longer carry forward after the program has commenced in September.

2. Will I be offered admission to an alternate program at uLethbridge if I am not offered admission to the B.N. or B.N. After Degree program?

If you would like to choose the Nursing Preparation Program (NPP) or another undergraduate program of choice, please log in to the BRIDGE to complete the [Request to Change Program](#) or email admissions@uleth.ca by June 30, 2021. There is limited space in the NPP and being offered admission does not guarantee registration in all your preferred courses each term. Please check the chart on page 2 of the NPP guide to determine when suggested courses are offered each term.

3. What is the most effective way to strengthen my academic qualifications?

a. For the next B.N. admission competition (Fall 2022)?

In most cases, improving your grades, especially in the required courses (Biology 30, Chemistry 30, English Language Arts 30-1, and Mathematics 30-1/30-2), is the most effective way to strengthen your qualifications for later B.N. admission competitions.

If you have weak grades in the required courses listed above, you may either upgrade these courses or take university courses in the subject area. For example, a better grade in CHEM 0500 at uLethbridge will be substituted for a weaker grade in Chemistry 30. In either case, improving your mark(s) is key for your success in next year's admission competition.

b. For the next B.N. After Degree admission competition (Fall 2022)

In most cases, improving your grades, especially in the required courses (Human Anatomy and Physiology and Statistics) along with the most recent 17 courses/51 credits is the most effective way to strengthen your qualifications and competitive admission average for later B.N. After Degree admission competitions.

4. Will my chances of being accepted into the B.N. or B.N. After Degree program in Fall 2022 improve if I pursue admission to another program at the University of Lethbridge?

Applicants who choose another program at uLethbridge can improve their chances of being accepted to the B.N. program for Fall 2022 by taking courses that strengthen their qualifications, for example, improving their grades in Biology, Chemistry, English and Mathematics. This can be done by remaining in an existing program or in the Nursing Preparation Program. The NPP does not guarantee admission to the Bachelor of Nursing program. NPP may provide better registration access to preferred courses; however, if you are having difficulty registering please contact an academic advisor at nursing@uleth.ca or arts.advising@uleth.ca.

5. If I am unsuccessful in this year's B.N. or B.N. After Degree admission competition, will I have an advantage in next year's competition?

Wait-lists are not carried forward from a previous admission year; however, interested applicants are welcome to apply again if they were unsuccessful gaining admission. The outcome of previous application(s) is not a factor. Applicants in any year's competition are evaluated solely on the quality of their academic qualifications at the admission decision document deadline of April 1 for that year. For admission to the B.N. program, improved grades enhance your qualifications and appropriate post-secondary courses may count towards degree requirements.

6. What options do I have if I'm not admitted to the B.N.?

You have a number of opportunities available at uLethbridge. The Nursing Preparation Program is offered through the Bachelor of Arts program in the Faculty of Arts and Science. Students who are in the NPP who do not ultimately pursue the B.N. can choose to complete the B.A. or any other program at uLethbridge. All courses completed in the NPP apply to any Bachelor of Arts program and most or all will apply to any other uLethbridge program as well. Academic advisors at uLethbridge are happy to help you explore your options should you choose to pursue an alternate program. It is important to work with your academic advisor throughout your first year at the University of Lethbridge. This will ensure that you understand all options available so you make the best decision based on your academic and personal goals. For example, if you know you want to work in healthcare, but are not accepted into our B.N. program, the Bachelor of Health Sciences, Aboriginal Health major might be a good fit as it aims to promote and protect the health of Canadians and populations around the globe.

The University's liberal education philosophy and the Nursing Preparation Program give students the opportunity to explore the degree and career options available. We have many great degree and program options for you right here at uLethbridge.

7. What program do I indicate when applying for student loans while in the NPP?

While in the NPP and applying for student loans you would identify your program as a Bachelor of Arts (B.A.).

8. How many admission intakes are offered each year for the B.N. and B.N. After Degree programs?

Both the B.N. and B.N. After Degree program offer admission only in the Fall (September) of each year. Interested applicants are welcome to apply the following year, and only updated information will require submission for subsequent applications. Applications open September 1 of the preceding admission intake. For example, the application for Fall 2022 will open as of September 1, 2021 for both the B.N. and B.N. After Degree program, should you commence the NPP in Fall 2021.



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
