Time Limits & Residence Requirement - The time limit for program completion is 7 years, with a time limit for retention of individual course credit of 7 years for Nursing courses and 10 years for Human Anatomy and Human Physiology courses. Students must complete all Year 3 and Year 4 courses at the University of Lethbridge (20 course equivalents [60 credit hours]). See Academic Regulations, Residence Requirements and Time Limits (p. 58) in the 2022/2023 Calendar.

Minimum Grade Requirements - A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in all Nursing courses, Biology 1160/Kinesiology 1160, and Biology 1161/Kinesiology 1161 (or equivalents). Any student who receives a grade of 'D+' or lower is required to repeat the course and achieve a grade of 'C-' or higher before being allowed to take further Nursing courses and proceed in the program.

Note: Due to the structured nature of the BN program, students are strongly discouraged from declaring a minor. Completing a minor will require taking courses above the minimum degree requirements and could lengthen the duration of your program. Consult your Advisor prior to declaring a minor.
