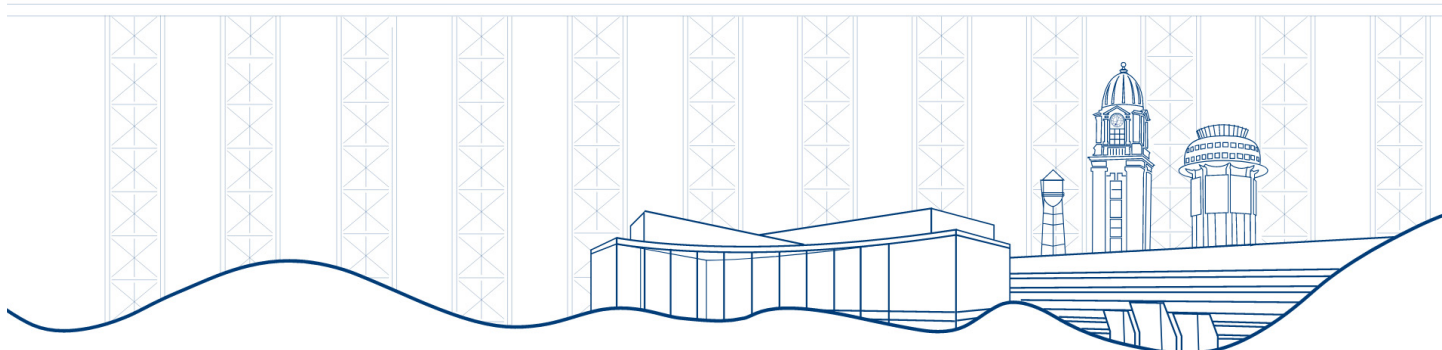

Program Requirements

Students must complete 10 courses (30.0 credit hours) from List A and List B towards the Post-Bachelor Certificate in Accounting Fundamentals and 6 courses (18.0 credit hours) from List B and List C towards the Post-Bachelor Certificate in Advanced Accounting. The 6 courses counting towards the Advanced Accounting Certificate must be distinct from the 10 courses counted towards the Accounting Fundamentals Certificate.

General Requirements

Students must meet the academic standards, program requirements, and graduation requirements according to the regulations set by the Dhillon School of Business, and as outlined in the Calendar including, but not limited to:

- ____ Successful completion of at least 16 courses (48.0 credit hours) with cumulative and graduation GPAs of at least 2.00 (on the University of Lethbridge 4.0 scale).
- ____ A graduation GPA in each individual certificate that meets Graduation Requirements.
- ____ A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in all Dhillon School of Business courses (ACCT, AGEM, FINC, HRLR, IGBM, IMGT, MGT, and MKTG) and courses cross-listed with Dhillon School of Business courses; and when required Economics 1010; Economics 1012; and Statistics 1770 in order to meet the requirements for the Combined Post-Bachelor Certificates in Accounting. It is important to note that the CPA professional body has their own minimum grade requirements. For further information, please contact an academic advisor or professional body representative.
- ____ Residence Requirement: Students must complete at least 5 courses towards the Post-Bachelor Certificate in Accounting Fundamentals and at least 5 distinct courses towards the Post-Bachelor Certificate in Advanced Accounting at the University of Lethbridge.
- ____ Completion of this program may take five terms of study due to course sequencing. All Combined Post-Bachelor Certificate in Accounting requirements must be completed within 5 years after acceptance into the Dhillon School of Business.
