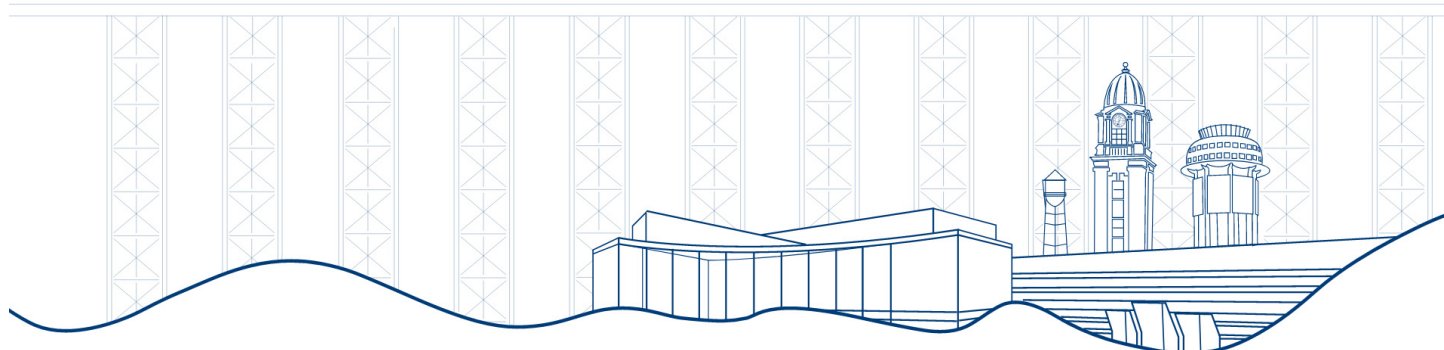

- _____ Completion of 20 course equivalents (60.0 credit hours) with a GPA of at least 2.00 (on the University of Lethbridge 4.0 scale) on courses taken for credit towards the degree.
- _____ Attain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50 (on the University of Lethbridge 4.0 scale) on all required Addictions Counselling, Health Sciences and Public Health courses taken for credit towards the degree.
- _____ Completion of two courses from each of Lists I, II, and III for the Liberal Education List Requirement (see **School of Liberal Education** in the 2024/2025 University of Lethbridge Calendar, www.ulethbridge.ca/ross/academic-calendar).
- _____ Not more than three Independent Study courses may be taken for credit towards the degree.
- _____ Residence requirement: 20 courses (60 credit hours).
- _____ All degree requirements must be completed within seven years of completion of the first required course offered by the Faculty of Health Sciences.
