Bachelor of Therapeutic Recreation



Our Bachelor of Therapeutic Recreation will prepare graduates to become certified therapeutic recreation specialists (CTRS). The program is the first of its kind in Alberta and one of only eight degree programs leading to therapeutic recreation certification in Canada. Therapeutic recreation uses functional intervention, education and recreation to help those with cognitive, physical, emotional and social limitations gain independence and reduce barriers to wellness and activity. This career field is emerging as one of the most promising growth professions in health care.



General Requirements

- _____ Successful completion of at least 20 course equivalents (60.0 credit hours) with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.50 (on the University of Lethbridge 4.0 scale) on all Therapeutic Recreation courses taken for credit towards the degree.
- _____ A minimum grade of 'C' is required in all Therapeutic Recreation (TREC) courses. Any student who receives a grade of 'C-' or lower is required to repeat the course and achieve a grade of 'C' or higher.
- _____ Residence requirement: 20 course equivalents (60.0 credit hours).
- _____ All degree requirements must be completed within six years of the first Therapeutic Recreation course used for credit towards the degree.

Optional Minor:

Due to the structured nature of the B.T.R. program, students are **strongly discouraged** from declaring a minor. Completing a minor will require taking courses above the minimum degree requirements and could lengthen the duration of your program. Consult your Academic Advisor prior to declaring a minor.
