Have the flexibility and independence to develop your own degree program from all the areas of the fine arts. All areas of the fine arts are available for students in the multidisciplinary major to choose their concentrations. You can now choose a first concentration from one area of fine arts (art, drama, music or new media), while choosing a second and third concentration from the other three. This can also include areas within the departments (Indigenous art, digital audio arts, technical design etc.). This new opportunity allows students the freedom to customize their education around technical, practical and academic focuses.

Note: Art - If the major area is Art, required courses include: two of Art 2005, Art 2006, Art 2010, Art 2015, Art 2023, Art 2027, Art 2033, Art 2060, Art 2061, Art 2350/ Indigenous Studies 2350; and one of Art History 1001 or Art History 1002.

Drama - If the major area is Drama, required courses include: Drama 1000, Drama 2100, Drama 2120 and Drama 2130.

Music - If the major area is Music, required courses include: one of Music 2010 or Music 2020; two of Music 1160, Music 2260, Music 3360, or Music 3460; and one of Music 1162 or Music 2162.

New Media - If the major area is New Media, required courses include: New Media 1000, New Media 2005, and New Media 2150.

In the second and third areas, students may take any combination of courses, including Music Ensemble Activities, providing prerequisites are met.

Liberal Education List Requirement

Only four courses (12.0 credit hours) in total may be counted from any one discipline toward the Lib Ed Requirement. Disciplines are identified by separate course subject codes. Cross-listed courses count toward the limit for both disciplines (e.g. Geography 3225/Global Business 3225 counts toward the limit for Geography and Dhillon School of Business courses).

Only four courses (12.0 credit hours) in total from the Faculty of Education (EDUC), Faculty of Health Sciences (AMHC, HLSC, INHL, NURS, PUBH, and TREC), and the Dhillon School of Business (ACCT, AGEM, DGTR, FINC, GLBU, HRLR, IGBM, MGT, and MKTG) may be counted towards the Lib Ed Requirement.

General Requirements

- _____ Successful completion of 40 courses with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.00 (on the University of Lethbridge’s 4.0 scale).
- _____ A minimum of 10 courses (30.0 credit hours) at the 3000/4000 level in the Faculty of Fine Arts and/or other Faculties or Schools.
- _____ A maximum of five Independent Studies (15.0 credit hours).
- _____ A maximum of five Disciplinary Credit Applied Studies courses (15.0 credit hours) may be completed for credit towards the degree.
- _____ A maximum of 12 courses (36.0 credit hours) may be taken at the 0100/1000 level for credit toward the degree. Activity courses and courses numbered in the range of 0520 to 0530 are exempted from this limit.
- _____ Residence requirement: 20 courses, including a minimum of 12 in the Faculty of Fine Arts and the last 10 taken for credit toward the degree.
