The BN After Degree is a 24-month continuous program starting in September of each year and is a collaborative program offered by the University of Lethbridge and Lethbridge Polytechnic. New applicants apply directly to the University of Lethbridge. Newly admitted students will register in and attend courses at Lethbridge Polytechnic for the first two semesters of the program. For the remaining semesters of the program, students will register in and attend courses at the University of Lethbridge. The program provides the essential background to write the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) to become a Registered Nurse (RN).

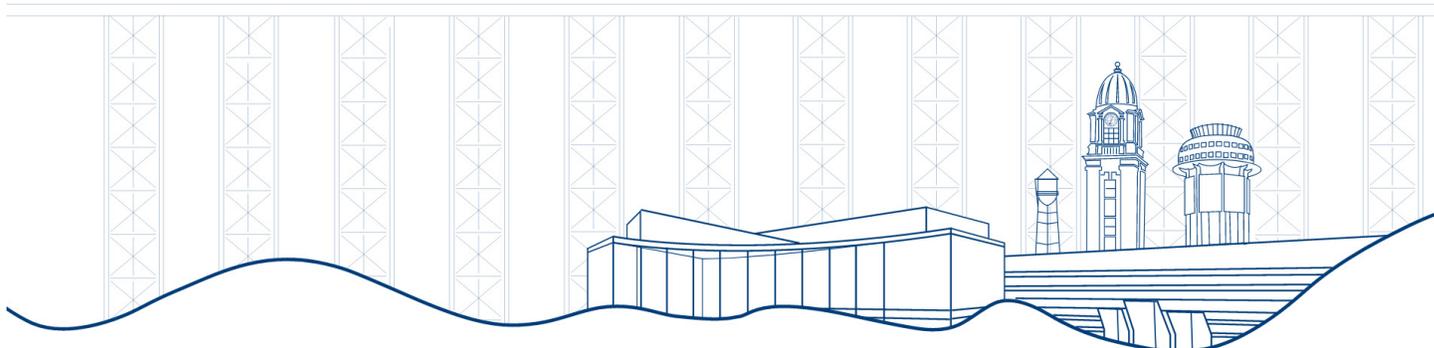

Notes

Due to the structured nature of the B.N. After Degree program, students are strongly discouraged from declaring a minor. Completing a minor will require taking courses above the minimum degree requirements and will lengthen the duration of your program. Consult your Advisor prior to declaring a minor.

General Requirements

- _____ Successful completion of at least 27 course equivalents (80.0 credit hours) with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.50 on all courses taken for credit towards the degree.
- _____ Residence requirement: 58.0 credit hours completed at the University of Lethbridge and 23.0 credit hours completed at Lethbridge Polytechnic.
- _____ All degree requirements must be completed within six years of the first Nursing course used for credit towards the degree.

Minimum Grade Requirement

A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in all Nursing courses. Any student who receives a grade of 'D+' or lower is required to repeat the course and achieve a grade of 'C-' or higher before being allowed to take further Nursing courses and proceed in the program.
