

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General Requirements

- _____ Successful completion of at least 41.3 course equivalents (124.0 credit hours) with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.00 on all courses taken for credit towards the degree.
- _____ Attain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50 on all required Nursing and Health Sciences courses taken for credit towards the degree.
- _____ Completion of the Liberal Education List Requirement (see **School of Liberal Education** in the 2026/2027 University of Lethbridge Calendar, www.ulethbridge.ca/ross/academic-calendar).
- _____ Residence Requirement: 20 courses including a minimum of 12 in Nursing and Health Sciences. In order to meet the residence requirement, students must complete all third and fourth year courses (20 course equivalents/ 60.0 credit hours) at the University of Lethbridge.
- _____ All degree requirements must be completed within seven years of completion of the first Nursing course used for credit towards the degree, with a time limit for retention of individual course credit of seven years for Nursing courses and ten years for Human Anatomy and Human Physiology courses. Students must complete all Year 3 and Year 4 courses at the University of Lethbridge (20 course equivalents [60 credit hours]).

Minimum Grade Requirement

A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in all Nursing courses, BIO 1160/KNES 1160, and BIO 1161/KNES 1161 (or equivalents). Any student who receives a grade of 'D+' or lower is required to repeat the course and achieve a grade of 'C-' or higher before being allowed to take further Nursing courses and proceed in the program.
