Nursing Preparation Program



The Nursing Preparation Program (NPP) is offered by the Faculty of Health Sciences and the Faculty of Arts and Science. It is intended for applicants who do not qualify for competitive admission to our Bachelor of Nursing or Bachelor of Nursing After Degree program. This program provides students with an opportunity to increase their admission averages to improve their chances of successful admission to the Bachelor of Nursing or Bachelor of Nursing After Degree program, complete prerequisite courses, and/or complete courses that will count toward our Bachelor of Nursing program requirements.

What determines my program requirements?

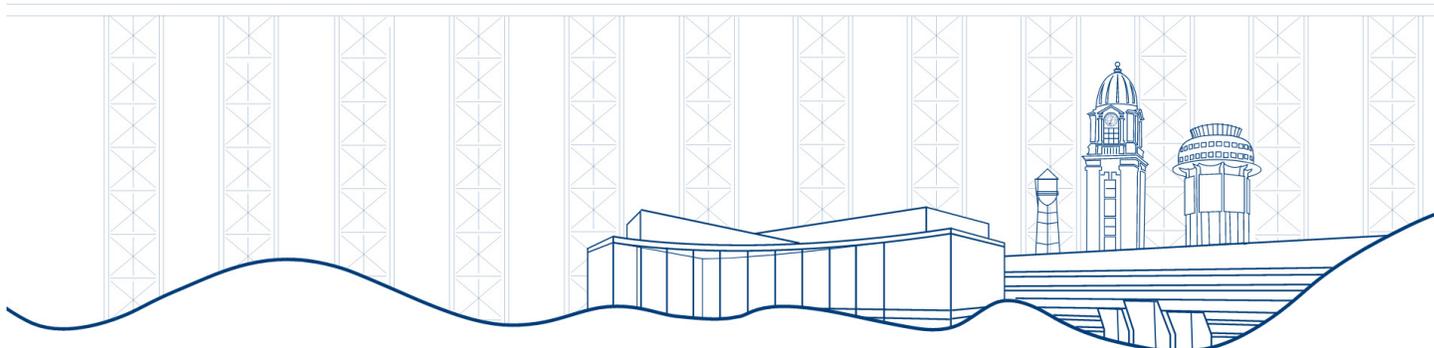

What courses do I take in this program?

NPP does not have any "required courses". The courses you will take in this program depend on your goals – whether you are trying to improve the competitiveness of your B.N. or B.N. After Degree application or hoping to decrease your course load if you are eventually admitted to the B.N. program.

Below, you can see which courses you can take depending on your goals with the Nursing Preparation Program.

What is the most effective way to strengthen my application to a Nursing program at ULehbridge?

For the B.N. program, we calculate your ranking average using an average of your actual grades for:

- English Language Arts 30-1
- Biology 30
- Chemistry 30 or Science 30
- Mathematics 30-1 or 30-2
- An eligible 5th 30-level subject*

* If you are not yet finished the 30-level required course, we will use your actual Grade 11 grades for the required courses to calculate your ranking.

For the B.N. After degree program, we calculate your ranking average using:

- your Casper test score,
- the grades received in Anatomy/Physiology, Statistics, and
- and the terms containing the most recent 17 university level subjects.

Human Anatomy and Physiology and Statistics must be completed within 10 years preceding the term of admission (*waivers will not be permitted if the ten-year limit has passed or if courses taken are less than the required credit weight; these courses will need to be retaken*).

Improving your grades in these courses is the most effective way to strengthen your application for later admission competitions.

If you have noncompetitive grades in the courses required for admission, you can take university-level courses in the subject area. See below for more information.

Note that admission to the NPP does not guarantee access to courses you may wish to upgrade. In some cases, you may not be able to register for a course because you do not meet a prerequisite, or you may be waitlisted (see www.ulethbridge.ca/ross/registration/register/waitlists for information about waitlisting).

Information for NPP students preparing to apply to the B.N. program

Here are some courses you could take at ULehbridge to improve noncompetitive grades in courses required for admission to the B.N. program:

English Language Arts 30-1	Writing 1000 or English 1900
Biology 30	² Kinesiology 1160; Kinesiology 1161; Biology 1010/BIO 0500
Chemistry 30	Chemistry 0500
Mathematics 30-1 or 30-2	¹ Mathematics 0500; Health Sciences 3450/Psychology 3450; Statistics 1770

1. This course can only be taken at ULehbridge if you have already completed Mathematics 30-1/Mathematics 30-2.

2. This course can only be taken at ULehbridge if you have already completed Biology 30.

If you are already a competitive applicant but were not admitted to Bachelor of Nursing, there are also some courses that students in NPP can take to lighten their future course load **if and when** they are admitted to Bachelor of Nursing. Many of these courses can also be used toward degree requirements in other ULehbridge programs, if you decide to pursue a program other than the Bachelor of Nursing.

Information for NPP students preparing to apply to the B.N. After Degree program

Applicants to the B.N. After Degree are ranked based on the **Casper test score and a GPA** calculated using Human Anatomy and Physiology, Statistics, and the terms containing the most recent additional 17 graded university-level term courses. Improving your grades, especially in the courses that are required for admission, is the most effective way to strengthen your competitive admission average for future admission competitions.

In addition to other admission requirements, applicants to the B.N. After Degree program must have:

- 3 credit hours in Human Anatomy **plus** 3 credit hours in Physiology **OR** 6 credit hours in Human Anatomy and Physiology (combined) ¹
- 3 credit hours in Statistics
- 3 credit hours in Fine Arts or Humanities ²
- 6 credit hours in Social Sciences ²

¹ Must have been completed within the last 10 years.
