

- _____ A minimum grade of 'C-' is required in all Dhillon School of Business courses (ACCT, AGEM, DGTR, FINC, GLBU, HRLR, IGBM, MGT, and MKTG) and courses cross-listed with Dhillon School of Business courses; and when required Economics 1010; Economics 1012; Statistics 1770; Writing 1000 or English 1900; and all courses in the major marked with an asterisk (*) in order to meet diploma requirements.
- _____ All diploma requirements must be completed within 10 years after admission into the Dhillon School of Business.
