

# **RDAR Launches Targeted Call for Research Proposals**

October 22, 2020

Results Driven Agriculture Research (RDAR) is excited to launch its inaugural \$4 million call for producer-led, agriculture research proposals – investing in ideas that will increase the competitiveness and profitability of Alberta's agriculture industry.

Through collaborative consultation with our industry partners and Advisory Committee, RDAR has identified four targeted research priorities for its first research call:

- Soil Health and Quality
- Water Quality and Efficiency
- Feed Production
- Plant and Animal Diseases and Pests

Proposals from researchers will be due on November 19, 2020 with final funding decisions in mid-December 2020.

RDAR will allocate up to \$4 million in funding towards research projects and the extension of project results developed through the research call.

At RDAR, we embrace scientific exploration - expanding Alberta's frontiers of agriculture research to develop solutions that benefit producers and consumers alike for a more forward-looking and profitable industry. We are led by the thinking that there is always a better way.

In October, RDAR and Agriculture and Forestry reached a funding agreement for agriculture research. The \$37-million annual agreement will see RDAR prioritize and fund agriculture research projects that reflect the needs of farmers and ranchers in Alberta.
